

Have a minor medical need?

You should go to your local ER if you're experiencing any symptoms that are serious or put your life at risk. Examples include chest pain, trouble breathing and heavy bleeding.

Primary care offices can have extended and weekend hours for patients. So call your primary care office first when you have a medical matter that's not life threatening.

Walk-in clinics offer care for medical matters that aren't life threatening. They also handle vaccinations and treat:

- Ear infections
- Strep throat
- Colds and flu
- Poison ivy
- Sprains and more

Urgent care centers offer

care for serious medical matters that aren't life threatening. They also handle vaccinations and treat:

- Sprains and minor fractures
- Cuts that require stitches
- Bronchitis
- Lower back pain
- Headaches and more
